Teachers and students of Nadi Sangam generously dedicated their time, talent, energy and resources to create a well-organized school-based campaign on the very close relationship between drugs and substance abuse, mental health, prevention of suicide, HIV AIDS with child abuse of various forms such as verbal abuse, physical abuse, sexual abuse, child labour and human trafficking. We also had a formal program where the school welcomed the day with marching followed by speeches from the guest speakers from the social welfare departments and the Fiji police force.

7. **Poster** – student designed poster based on the theme and display at their classroom frontage.
8. **Slogan tree** – prepared and displayed.
9. **Fruit Drink week** - encouraged students to bring bottle of fresh natural fruit juice and remind them that those beverages are healthy for their body.
10. **Marching** – all classes to prepare their own banners or flags for the marching.
11. **Guest Speakers** – from social welfare department and Fiji police force.
12. **Red wear** - students and teachers wore red outfit.

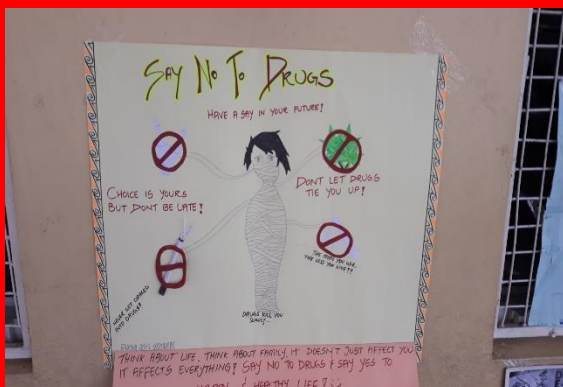
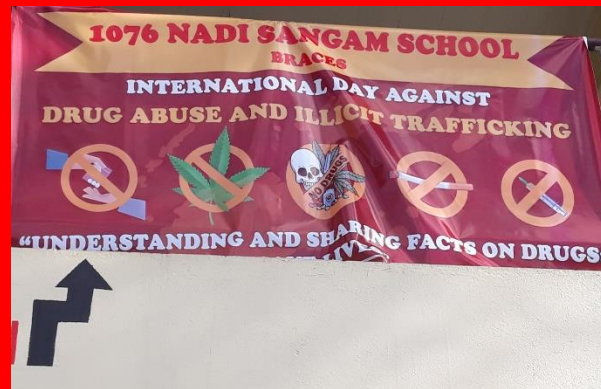




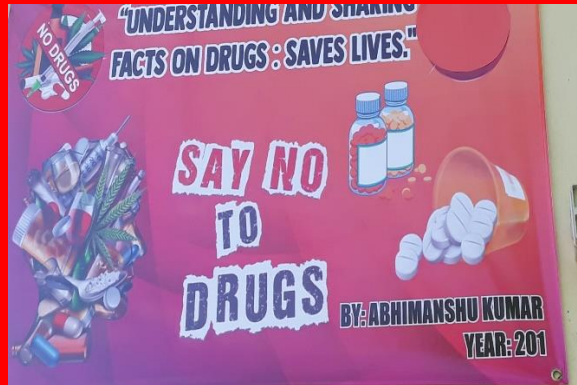
